GICC students win prizes in Bharatham 2012



Considered as a national level Bharathanatyam dance competition, Bharatham, now in its 6th year, is organized by Toa Payoh West CC.

GICC students have not only participated but won accolades and appreciation in Bharatham since the very first year. In 2012, seven GICC students – Subiksha Ganesan, Adithi Bhat, Vidisha Ahire, Akshara Maran, Vaishalee Rajaraman, Abishek Balamurugan and Simrita Agrawal qualified for the finals. Teachers Ms Atira, Ms Srilakshmi and Ms Shobinya relentlessly trained these

students to compete with various dancers from different cultural centres of Singapore. The most awaited moment, the finals of Bharatham 2012 was on 14th April at the hall of Toa Payoh West CC which was packed to capacity. The Guest of Honour for the occasion was Member of Parliament, Mr Hri Kumar Nair. There were three judges each from India, Singapore and Malaysia to judge the finals. The judges had a tough time deciding the winners as all participants displayed great virtuosity and talent. Later, the judges gave feedback to each participant after their performance. The youngest contestant at the competition was GICC student Adithi Bhat. One of the judges was so moved that Adithi received special blessings after her mesmerizing performance.

It was a proud moment for GICC when the results were announced. In category A-7 to 11 years, the top 3 positions were bagged by GICC students. In category B-12 to 17 years, GICC bagged the 3rd and 4th places. Amidst thunderous applauses from an appreciative audience, the winners received trophies and won cash for their positions. The prizes were given by Mr Hri Kumar Nair.
